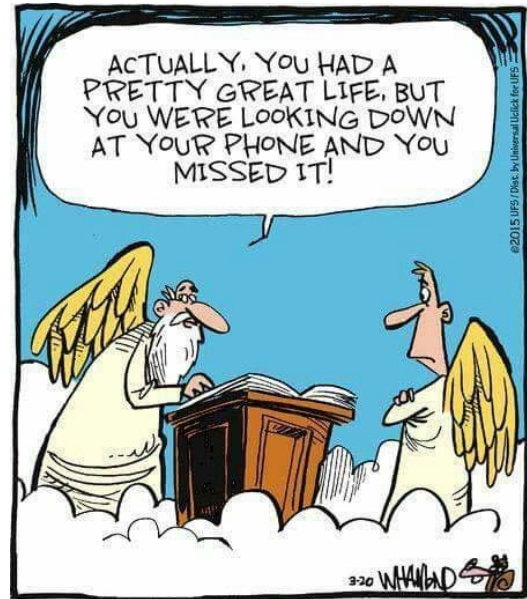

**SAINT OF THE MONTH**  
**OUR LADY OF FATIMA**  
**FEASTDAY: MAY 13**

At Fatima, Portugal, beginning on May 13, 1917, and continuing on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of the next six months, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three shepherd children: Lucia dos Santos (9yrs) and her cousins Jacinta Marto (10yrs) and Francisco Marto (11yrs). Mary asked the children to pray the rosary for world peace, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia.

During her appearances to the children, Mary confided three secrets to them. Lucia revealed the First Secret in 1927 – concerning devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. She also revealed the Second Secret which was a vision of hell: to save poor sinners from here, the world devotion to the Immaculate Heart must be established. The Third Secret was a vision of the death of the Pope and other religious figures. The Vatican revealed this third secret on June 26, 2000.

In July 1917, the Virgin Mary promised the children a miracle for her last apparition on October 13, 1917 - so that all would believe. What happened that day is known as the “Miracle of the Sun”. Over 70,000 people gathered at the site. The phenomenon was described as the “sun’s dance”, with the sun appearing to change colors, moving fast and whirling – at times seeming to approach the earth. In addition to the Miracle of the Sun, the children stated that the Lady told them of a great sign in the night sky which would precede a second great war. On January 25, 1938, the bright northern lights (the aurora borealis) were seen as far south as North Africa, Bermuda, and California – just one month later, Hitler seized Austria, and eight months later invaded Czechoslovakia.

Lucia became a Carmelite nun. Sister Lucia claimed that the Virgin Mary had predicted the deaths of both Jacinta (1920) and Francisco (1919) during their second apparition on June 13, 1917. Lucia asked the Virgin if the three children would go to heaven, and Mary replied that Jacinta and Francisco would go soon, but Lucia would remain to establish devotion to her Immaculate Heart. Sister Lucia died on February 13, 2005 at the age of 97.

In 1930, during the pontificate of Pope Pius XI, official church recognition of the apparition events were found to be as “worthy of belief”. Pope Pius XII consecrated Russia to the Blessed Virgin Mary on July 7, 1952. Our Lady of Fatima is credited by Pope John Paul II with saving his life during the assassination attempt May 13, 1981.

The telephone number is (318) 219-7222. This line goes directly to a voicemail that is addressed only to Bishop Duca. Should you need to call this number to report incidents of fiscal abuse, be assured that Bishop Duca will act on the information in a confidential manner to make positive changes. This new phone line is being established now in order to increase our commitment to being transparent in our financial affairs and to maintain the “good practices” proposed by our insurance company to insure a responsible level of accountability. It is not being established in response to any suspected problem present in any parish or Diocesan facility.



CHRISTIANS of Karamales in Iraq NEED our HELP and there's a "fun and games knight" coming to aid them at SEAS

On Saturday, April 28, in the Burleigh Center, there will be a "Fun and Games Knight" from 7-10 pm. All proceeds will benefit the Knights' Christian Refugee Relief Fund, in this instance specifically for the Christians of Karamales. "While SEAS Council 9260 is hosting the event, Councils from all over the Diocese are helping

out," said K of C Diocesan Administrator, Mike Rose. Tickets are \$30/person (adults only), which covers heavy hors d'oeuvres, and a packet of \$100 in "fun money" to give a good launch to the evening. In addition to casino, bingo and other games there will be a silent auction, and prizes for the three highest "fun money" winners. The tickets are now available through parish K of C Councils, or through Program Director, Joe Sawyer, at 294-5937. They will also be available at the door.

Why, one might ask, specifically to benefit the people of this ancient town of Karamales on the Nineveh plain? In short, it's a special target for K of C relief." Here's why. In 2014, Fr. Bazi, residing there, was tortured and nearly killed by ISIS terrorists. His church and the town itself were reduced to rubble because his church had become a home for Christian refugees facing genocide. More recently, many inhabitants of Karamales have begun to return home and start the rebuilding process. This is in part due to the defeat of ISIS, and in part to a commitment of \$2 million by the Knights of Columbus to help restore much of the town's infrastructure, in addition to providing tons of food and supplies (which have already been distributed).
