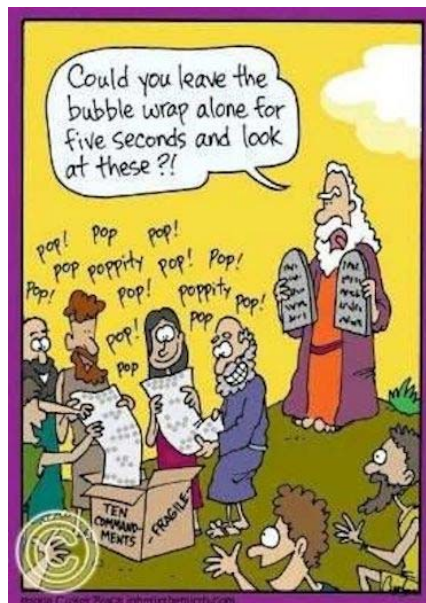

The Diocese of Shreveport has set up an anonymous and completely confidential phone line for you to report instances of known or suspected misuse of parish, school or diocesan assets including fraud, excessive waste or fiscal abuse. The telephone number is (318) 219-7222. This line goes directly to a voicemail that is addressed only to Bishop Duca. Should you need to call this number to report incidents of fiscal abuse, be assured that Bishop Duca will act on the information in a confidential manner to make positive changes. This new phone line is being established now in order to increase our commitment to being transparent in our financial affairs and to maintain the "good practices" proposed by our insurance company to insure a responsible level of accountability. It is not being established in response to any suspected problem present in any parish or Diocesan facility.

SAINT OF THE MONTH

ST JOHN FISHER

FEASTDAY - JUNE 22

Born in Beverly, Yorkshire in 1469, John Fisher was the eldest son of Robert Fisher (a modestly prosperous merchant) and Agnes his wife. His early education was at Beverly Grammar School. In 1484, he went to the University of Cambridge where he became under the influence of William Melton, a pastorally-minded theologian. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1487 and a Master of Arts degree in 1491. Also in 1491, he received a papal dispensation to enter the priesthood despite being underage. He was ordained to the priesthood on December 17, 1491. A scholar and a priest, humble and conscientious, he managed despite occasional opposition to administer a whole university. He promoted the study of classical Latin, Greek, and Hebrew authors. He placed great weight upon pastoral commitment, and his foundations were also dedicated to prayer for the dead.

At the insistence of King Henry VII, on October 14, 1504, Fisher was appointed to Bishop of Rochester by Papal Bull. He remained in this English Diocese the remaining 31 years of his life. Fisher preached the funeral oration for both King Henry VII and his wife Lady Margaret when they died in 1509. John maintained a passionate interest in the University of Cambridge where he had a lifetime appointment as University's Chancellor.

When King Henry VIII tried to divorce Queen Catherine of Aragon, Fisher became the Queen's chief supporter on the indissolubility of marriage. Fisher also engaged in secret activities to overthrow Henry.

At age 65 on June 22, 1535, Fisher was executed at Tower Hill, London by order of Henry VIII during the English Reformation for refusing to accept the King as Supreme head of the Church of England and for upholding the Catholic Church's doctrine of Papal Primacy. He was named a Cardinal shortly before his death.

St. John Fisher is venerated in the Catholic Church, the Church of England, and churches in the Anglican Communion. He was beatified on December 29, 1886 in Rome, Kingdom of Italy by Pope Leo XIII; and, canonized on May 19, 1935 in Vatican City by Pope Pius XI. His patronage is the Diocese of Rochester. *Karen Tucker, Lay Ecclesial Minister*
