All Saints Day / All Souls Day

Feast of All Saints November 1st

Originally, Pope Boniface IV proclaimed May 13, 610 the Feast of the Holy Martyrs to honor all those martyrs not listed in their local Roman records. Many known martyrs were on their calendar, but many Christians had been thrown to the lions for witnessing to their faith, and not all of them were known to the community. In 835, Pope Gregory IV changed the date to November 1 and renamed it the Feast of All Saints. According to a Catholic Christianity source, a theory for the change in the date was that it was a large and popular feast, and to have it in the fall enabled them to use the fall harvest for the food supply. The Change in the name probably came about because there was a change in custom as to who was regarded as a "Saint". Initially celebrating only martyrs, after the Roman persecutions ended, the title was also given to others who had led Gospel centered lives.

On the Feast of All Saints, we celebrate all saints known and unknown who have preceded us to heaven.

Feast of All Souls November 2nd

This is a Roman Catholic Feast Day commemorating all the faithful departed or those baptized Christians believed to be in Purgatory. On All Souls Day we offer our prayers and Mass for their release from Purgatory.

The Feast of All Souls began in the seventh century with Monks who decided to offer Mass on the day after Pentecost for their deceased community members. Odilo, Abbot of Cluny, established All Souls Day in the eleventh century; the feast having been originally celebrated in the Easter Season, his Benedictine Monastery moved the feast to November 2, so as to celebrate along with All Saints Day.

On the Feast of All Souls, we are reminded of our obligations to live a holy life and that there will be purification of souls of those destined for Heaven—in this life or in Purgatory.

These are days of remembrance, celebration, and prayer. We are all souls striving to become saints in the wonderful kingdom of God. Remember, celebrate, and pray.
